

# What Every Multinational Company Needs to Know about . . . The New Antidumping and Countervailing Duty Investigations of Aluminum Extrusions

On October 1, 2024, the U.S. Department of Commerce (DOC) initiated the first of two antidumping (AD) and countervailing duty (CVD) investigations of parallel imports from China, India, and Mexico of aluminum extrusions.

DOC initiated the investigations because of a petition filed by U.S. aluminum extrusion producers on many different U.S. importers and exporters.

The DOC's investigation of parallel imports from China, India, and Mexico of aluminum extrusions is the first of two investigations initiated by the DOC in 2024. The second investigation is the DOC's investigation of parallel imports from China, India, and Mexico of aluminum extrusions.

The DOC's investigation of parallel imports from China, India, and Mexico of aluminum extrusions is determined by where the extrusion is produced.

Under the AD and CVD laws, the scope of the case carves out a number of products, and follows a number of exclusions from the scope of the investigation.
