France | Olympic Consulate Begins Operations

The French government has launched a new Olympic consulate system to process visa applications for the Olympic and Paralympic games in 2024.

Key Points:

- Nearly 70,000 participants are expected to apply for visas in connection with the Paris games, in addition to visitors seeking tourist visas.
- French authorities have begun operating the new Olympic consulate system for processing applications entirely online via the government's <u>France-Visas online platform</u>.
- The Paris 2024 <u>official website</u> provides additional information for those traveling to the Olympic games, which will take place from July 26 to Aug. 11.

Additional Information: The EU <u>agreed</u> in November to introduce an online visa system throughout the Schengen zone. Officials stated that a digital system will be more secure and provide additional convenience to travelers by avoiding the need to bring documents or wait for an in-person appointment. The Olympic consulate system represents France's first venture into processing evisas and a similar digitalized visa process. Officials will process short-stay visa applications for accredited individuals and issue e-visas that will be stored directly on participants' official Olympic passes.

BAL Analysis: Travelers should be aware that appointment and processing delays may occur due to the significant increase in visitors during this time. BAL will continue following developments in the lead-up to the Olympic games and will provide updates as information becomes available.
