## ICO Introduces Consultation Series on Data Protection and Generative AI

The Information Commissioner's Office (ICO) recently launched a <u>consultation</u> series on how data protection laws should apply to the development and use of generative AI models ("Gen AI"). In the coming months, the ICO will publish further views on how to interpret specific requirements of <u>UK GDPR</u> and <u>Part 2 of the DPA 2018</u> in relation to Gen AI. This first part of the consultation focusses on whether it is lawful to train Gen AI on personal data scraped from the web. The consultation seeks feedback from stakeholders with an interest in Gen AI.

As outlined by the ICO, web scraping will involve the collection and processing of personal data, which may not have been placed online directly by the data subjects themselves. To comply with the UK GDPR, Gen AI developers would need to ensure there is a valid lawful basis for their processing under UK GDPR, as well as comply with the relevant information requirements pertaining to indirect personal data collection.

The deadline to submit a response is 1 March 2024.
