## Blue is the New Red – United States Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) Switches Ink

Employers and foreign nationals should not be concerned – beginning July 1, 2014, USCIS switched its red secure ink for blue secure ink. This change will affect the following stamps:

- 1. Department of Homeland Security's Parole Stamp
- 2. Temporary I-551 Alien Documentary Identification and Telecommunication (ADIT) Stamp
- 3. Refugee Stamp
- 4. Asylum Stamp
- 5. Initial / Replacement Form I-94 Stamp

Employers reviewing employee documents for Form I-9 employment eligibility purposes should take note of the change.
