Court enters scheduling order in CFPB Acting Director dispute

Following a <u>scheduling conference held earlier today</u>, Judge Kelly entered an order setting a briefing schedule and hearing date for Laurena English's motion for a preliminary injunction in her action seeking a declaration that she, rather than Mick Mulvaney, has the legal right to serve as CFPB Acting Director.

The order sets the following filing deadlines:

- December 6, 2017. Plaintiff's motion for preliminary injunction.
- December 8, 2017. Amicus curiae briefs in support of Plaintiff's motion.
- December 18, 2017. Defendants' opposition to Plaintiff's motion.
- December 18, 2017. Amicus curiae briefs in support of Defendants' opposition.
- December 20, 2017. Plaintiff's reply in support of her motion.

The order sets December 22, 2017 as the date for a hearing on Ms. English's preliminary injunction motion. Unlike the court's order denying the <u>temporary restraining order</u> requested by Ms. English, its ruling on her preliminary injunction motion will be appealable to the U.S. Court of Appeals for the D.C. Circuit.
